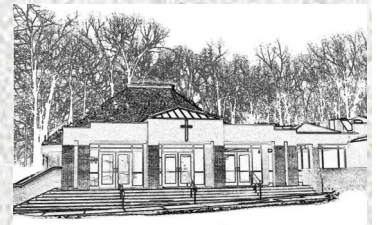

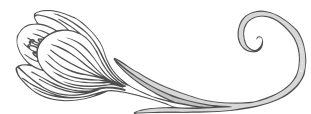

Do You Know H2O?

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters." (Genesis 1:1-2) God's first creation on earth was WATER. He made it so all living things required water to live on earth.

"On the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them.'" (John 7: 37:38) God's greatest gift to us is LIVING WATER to cleanse our sins so that we can live forever.

If God made water first, and water the symbol of His greatest gift to us, then we must use it to grow His kingdom on earth. **How?**
By drinking it!

Did you know...

- Roughly 80% of the human body is water, and the human brain is 85%.
- The average person in the US drinks less than a quart (32 ounces) of water a day.
- The average adult loses more than 80 ounces of water every day through sweating, breathing, and eliminating wastes.
- By the time a person feels thirsty, his body has lost over 1 percent of its total water amount.

Every system in your body depends on water, and if you are drinking less water than your body uses, it directly affects every system in your body and your overall health.

How much do I drink?

There is no one estimate for how much water the average American needs each day. Instead, the Institute of Medicine has set an adequate intake of 125 ounces (about 15 cups) for men and 91 ounces (about 11 cups) for women. Note that this is not a daily target, but a general guide. In most people, about 80% of this water volume comes from beverages; the rest comes from food. For additional information how water and how it affects your body, go to:

*Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good. His love endures forever!
Give thanks to the God of gods. His love endures forever! Give
thanks to the Lord of lords. His love endures forever! To him who*

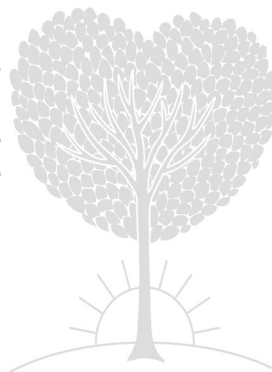
*alone does great wonders. His love endures forever! Who by his understanding made
the heavens. His love endures forever! Who spread out the earth upon the waters. His
love endures forever! Who made the great lights. His love endures forever! The sun to
govern the day. His love endures forever! The moon and stars to govern the night. His
love endures forever! To him who struck down the firstborn of Egypt. His love endures
forever! And brought Israel out from among them. His love endures forever! With a
mighty hand and outstretched arm. His love endures forever! To him who divided the
Red Sea asunder. His love endures forever! And brought Israel through the midst of it.
His love endures forever! But swept Pharaoh and his army into the Red Sea. His love
endures forever! To him who led his people through the desert. His love endures
forever! Who struck down great kings. His love endures forever! And killed mighty
kings. His love endures forever! Sihon king of the Amorites. His love endures forever!
And Og king of Bashan. His love endures forever! And gave their land as an
inheritance. His love endures forever! An inheritance to his servant Israel. His love
endures forever! To the One who remembered us in our low estate. His love endures
forever! And freed us from our enemies. His love endures forever! And who gives food
to every creature. His love endures forever! Give thanks to the God of heaven. His
love endures forever! (Psalm 136)*

This psalm is a litany of praise! Like its companion poem (Psalm 135), this psalm reviews Israel's history and combines citations from other traditional evocations of the Creator God, the Master of nature and history. It is unique among the Psalms because of the recurring refrain "His love endures forever!" which is repeated throughout all 26 verses of the Psalm. The British Baptist preacher C. H. Spurgeon once remarked, "We shall have this [refrain] repeated in every verse of this song, but not once too often."

The Lord is Himself goodness! The poem invites Israel to give thanks to God for all that He has accomplished, despite the presence of evil. Israel must give thanks to God for His goodness in creating the world, in the Exodus, wilderness, and conquest. The Creator God is an intelligent architect who formed the great luminaries: the sun, moon, and stars, whose seasonal alternations produce the life cycles of the calendar. Israel's slavery in Egypt and the plagues led to divine salvation. The killing of the Egyptian firstborn and kings in the poem may jar our modern sensibilities. While that act does not seem like "enduring love," and the victims certainly did not perceive it as such, it still demonstrated God's goodness for an oppressed Israelite.

Psalm 136 is a great reminder that despite our own sin, evil, and imperfections, God is infinitely good, perfect, and unchanging. When we focus on the goodness of God we are awestruck by His abiding love and compassion for us. Humanity has witnessed the abundance of His goodness through our Lord's incarnation. It is Christ, offered to us freely, that articulates the profound love of God. So when we are going through pain, hardship, facing death, or even suffering, let us remember that "His love endures forever!"

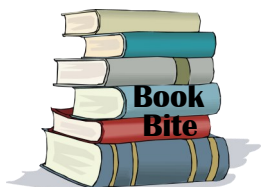

***Distressed But Not Destroyed:
The Story of Andrea—
God's Assignment***

Please plan to attend the Celebrate Christian Literature luncheon program in the Fellowship Hall on Sunday, April 13 at 12:45 PM, featuring Pamela Gardner. As we finish up the light lunch offered for \$5 per person, Pam will share with us how she learned to stand in the hope of 2 Corinthians 4:8: "We are troubled on every side, yet not distressed; we are perplexed, but not in despair...." (KF21)

Pam and her husband Allan, a traveling evangelist, moved from their native Australia to Chicago, Illinois with their small son and 8-month-old daughter, Andrea. Here Allan studied at the Moody Bible Institute, and Andrea underwent heart surgery which led to her subsequent brain damage. Andrea's seizures became a regular part of life in the Gardner home.

Several ministerial opportunities for Allan brought the growing family home to Australia, then back to the United States. Allan accepted the Pastorate at McLean Bible Church, settling in for 10 years, which gave Andrea an opportunity to have more routine in her schedule, longer family times with her dad (who was no longer traveling so much), and some extraordinary teachers who were truly called to teach special education. Allan later became International Director for Ambassadors for Christ International and continues to travel for AFCI to date.

When Pam accepted Christ as her Lord at age 13 and committed her life to the Lord for missions at 16, she had no idea that she would travel the world for Him. Nor did she know that she would have her own mission under the roof of their home when she and Allan married in 1955. But Pam knew then and still knows now that "the name of the Lord is a strong tower; the righteous run into it and is safe" (Proverbs 18:10 NAS).

There is so much more to Pam's story. Please don't miss this opportunity to hear how her journey of adversity laced with joy has been used by God to inspire, encourage and change lives in many countries. In fact, the book is available in Romanian, and a Spanish translation will be available soon!

Unspeakable Joy: Facing Your Fears

I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. (John 15:11)

Several months ago, I rode down two stories in a see-through mall elevator all by myself. To some, that may sound ridiculously comical, but to me it was a huge accomplishment. You see, I had faced one of my worst fears: the fear of heights. And I experienced the kind of personal joy that is akin to the testimonies of people who win the lottery. It is not only the big feats in life that bring us joy, but often it is those personal but measured accomplishments that do. Though at times others may benefit from what we do, we should face some of our fears just for our own joy.

When was the last time you challenged yourself to that kind of joy? It is a lot more meaningful if the motivation starts with you. Some years ago, I was bribed into getting into one of those rickety Eiffel Tower elevators that sky-rocketed to the top. I had to stay up there for an hour, and I nearly lost my mind. What is worse, I had not accomplished anything, except the memory of having appeased someone else. But that see-through elevator ride at the mall did *wonders* for me.

What new or renewed venture would you like to experience simply because of the pure pleasure that might come from it? You should stock up on those kinds of joyous moments, because they will give you glorious nuggets to relish when the challenges of life are weighing on you. Maybe it is time to dust off that old high school band instrument. Men, how about taking a knitting class so that you can knit that grand-baby, or your infant niece or nephew, a cute little blanket? Who says that a female has to do it? These are mere suggestions, but in order to be joyous, the impetus needs to generate from within your own soul. I sometimes think that we lose the true flavor of life because we forget to marinate those more serious and demanding items in spontaneous, fun, and yes, even scary adventures.

Our lives tend to be too structured, leaving little room for the *mindless behavior* of life's simplest risks. Perhaps we think too hard and talk ourselves out of facing our fears. But let me be reasonable here. My fear of rodents is one that I have no desire to overcome, but attacking other fears can yield great benefits for me. Jesus shed a lot of blood so that our joy may be complete. Yet we often forfeit that joy by taking life too seriously. Do something that scares you, but that will make you literally laugh out loud at yourself once you accomplish it. That is exactly what I did when I walked out of that **glass** elevator. I laughed out loud.

Signing Up For Life!

"...but because Jesus lives forever, He has a permanent priesthood. Therefore He is able to save forever those who come to God through Him, because He always lives to intercede for them." (Hebrews 7:24, 25)

Becoming a follower of Jesus is a wonderful decision that begins a journey that lasts a lifetime and forever. It begins in a moment when old things are passed away and "all things become new" (2 Corinthians 5:17). Jesus referred to it as being "born again" (John 3:3) when He was talking to Nicodemus. The Gospel is not just the beginning...it is the beginning, the middle and the ending. As a believer you are in it for the long haul...but no worries, Jesus is there too!
