A fellow disciple on the Way...

Giving: A Supreme Christian Virtue

"I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in who loved me and gave Himself for me" (Galatians

the Son of God, 2:19b-20 NRSV)

When the great Protestant Reformer, Martin Luther, described the nature of God's love, he used the metaphor of "flowing": God's love "flows forth and bestows good" (LW 31:57). The metaphor of flowing reveals the *outbound* and *unidirectional* movement of God's gifts to us: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16).

What happens to the flow when it reaches us? Does it stop? If the flow stops with us, we will then become what is uncharacteristic of God. But we are created to be and act like God (Gen 1:27). And so the flow of God's gifts should not stop when it reaches us! The *outbound* movement of God's gifts to us must continue. Indeed, giving to others is the very purpose for which God gives us the gifts. We are not simply the final destination in the flow of God's gifts. The gifts flow to us, and they flow on from us! We are simultaneously receivers and givers. We receive from Christ and we give to others, especially those in need.

Luther further used the imagery of a *conduit* to express the idea of flow: We are *channels* of God's gifts to others. However, we are not merely a conduit that conveys goods and does not benefit from them. We benefit from the goods that we convey as well as bestow them on others. Luther believed that Christ is the *source* of all gifts and the *model* for human giving. Again, Luther believed that Christ is the *agent* of our giving; our giving is an echo of His because He indwells us.

In Galatians 2:19-20, Paul writes that our lives as Christians are paradoxically both our own ("the life I now live in the flesh") and not ours ("it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me"). It is not just that Christ sends the goods to flow *into*

us; Christ makes the goods flow from us as well by indwelling, motivating, and acting through us. May we give generously, and may our giving be Christ-like!

- **D Dedication -** Commit to honoring God with your body and your choices concerning your eating and physical activities.
- **I Inspire –** Inspire to change the normal holiday behaviors of overindulgence and lack of physical activity.
- **E Eat Less/Exercise More -** Set two realistic goals that you can control over the holidays, e.g., I will half my dessert portions or I will walk 30 minutes, 4 days a week (remember, you can walk in place or up/down stairs in your house too).


