Jesus, Our Savior

"He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of our sins." (Ephesians 1:13-14, NRSV)

The doctrine of salvation remains the central theme of the Bible. Biblical salvation refers to God's gracious action in delivering people or individuals from a threatening situation in which they are unable to rescue themselves. The threatening situation may range from political, social, or mental oppression or physical illness to a spiritual consequence of sinful behavior. The agent of salvation may be a human liberator, or the gracious outworking of God's own purpose through an event or situation in life. Yet it is God who provides the agent, and it is God alone who ultimately saves.

In the Old Testament, the concept of salvation is rooted in God's deliverance of Israel from Egyptian bondage through Moses (see Exodus 1-13). In the New Testament, Jesus is the source of salvation. He is the **Christ** (*Messiah*) and **Savior** (*sōtēr*) of the world (Matt 1:21; Luke 2:11; John 3:16; 4:42). **Jesus is the ultimate agent of God's salvation** (Acts 4:12; Phil 2:9-11; Col 1:15-20). By faith in Jesus, believers are saved from bondage to sin and its physical and spiritual consequences and transferred to a new realm of existence (Rom 5:1-11).

The experience of salvation is a present reality, which begins the moment we accept God's **steadfast love**, **peace** (*shalom*), **righteousness**, and **truth** in Jesus Christ.

"Listen! I am standing at the door, knocking; if you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in to you and eat with you, and you with me" (Rev 3:20).

We ask that you:


- Bag all clothing (please fold)

<u>Not A Fan.</u> What Does It Mean To Really Follow Jesus?

"Are you a fan of Jesus?" What would your answer be? When I first started reading this book I thought, "Yes, I am a fan! I love Jesus." However, is that really what Jesus wants?


You attend every movie featuring a certain actor, you know the stats of your sports hero, and you can recite lyrics from your favorite songs. In short, you're a huge fan. But, are you treating Jesus the same as the other people you admire?

The truth is Jesus wants more than the church attendance, occasional prayer, and the ability to recite scripture – the fan response. He's looking for people who are actually willing to sacrifice in order to follow Him.

What exactly does that mean? Is there a difference in making a decision for Him or a commitment to Him? Is it right to have knowledge about Him or to develop an intimacy with Him? Is Jesus one of many that you follow and admire or the One and only? Are you self-empowered or Spirit-filled?

The invitation to follow Jesus is complex in its simplicity, and this book, written for teens, lays out just what Jesus wants in a clear, easy to understand way. Kyle Idleman uses humor, humility, and a deep understanding of the Bible to "look at what it means to call yourself a Christian and follow the radical call Jesus presents." Make no mistake, although the book's message is simple, the invitation will take courage, daily sacrifice, and true commitment. Are you ready?

You've Got A Friend

Friendship no longer carries the connotation that it did when Carole King and James Taylor simultaneously recorded their megahits four decades ago. Interestingly, some years back, I obliged my daughter when she suggested that I establish a Myspace account. However, the second I hit the submit button, the smiling face of a young man popped up in the lower right corner of the screen. Startled, I asked, "Who is he?" She replied, "He is your first friend." I then retorted, "But, I don't know him. Besides, I am old enough to be his mother, so, how he is my friend?" Clearly, my children and I were raised in different worlds. I know how real friendships are made, with real people who actually talk to each other in real life, and in real time. You see, the notion of friendship has been trampled upon by our modern culture.

You just call out my name, and you know wherever I am
I'll come running to see you again.
Winter, spring, summer, or fall, all you have to do is call,
and I'll be there
You've got a friend.

It is not easy to be a friend. Real friends support one another when they are down, but they also hold one another accountable when wrong. I worry that those of us who know better are slowly falling into the abyss of today's idea of friendship.

The social media site, Facebook, makes it easy for us to "unfriend" people. However, in real life, we should think matters through before doing that. We should ask ourselves, Has that individual betrayed me; are they trustworthy; do they deplete me, or do they add value to my life? Now, with one click, we can simply dismiss people from our lives. Some have been "unfriended" because they have expressed different political views, religious views, "liked" a certain photograph on Facebook, or for other trivial reasons. Sadly, some of these people were friends in real life, but they allowed current social trends to influence them, without having exercised the benefit of talking through possible offenses as mature people should. Sadly, many Christians have also embraced that "just unfriend them" attitude. However, the Bible tells us that if we have an issue with someone, we are to go and attempt reconciliation.

I invite each of you to rethink the meaning of friendship. Does it have the same meaning to you as it did thirty years ago? Have you ever *unfriended* someone over a trivial matter, simply because it was easier than putting forth the effort to reconcile offenses? We can restore the real meaning of friendship by taking a few steps. Talk to people, visit them, write them in longhand, cry with them, pray with them, and lastly, hold your friends accountable when they are wrong, especially when they mistreat others. Let them do the same with you. Now, let's take back the true meaning of friendship, everybody.

"THE MAN OF STEEL"

"...so He got up from the meal, took off His outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around His waist" (John 13:4).

When I was growing up I loved Superman. He was the ultimate hero. "Faster than a speeding bullet...stronger than a locomotive...able to leap tall buildings with a single bound." I couldn't wait for that moment in every show or comic book when Clark Kent would find a phone booth and tear off his outer clothes to reveal the suit with the "S" on his chest that showed who he really was. When playing around the house I would sometimes get a large towel and use it as a cape as I pretended to fly to rescue Metropolis from the evils of Lex Luthor. This year a new Superman movie has come out, "The Man Of Steel." As I watch the trailers I am transported back to my days wearing a towel cape and dreaming of rescuing people. I also begin to think about my real Savior, Jesus.

The Scripture above is a moment in the life of our Savior when a true "hero" is defined and illustrated. The passage is literally moments before the ultimate battle for the salvation of the world. Our hero is in an upper room with His key followers. They are wanted men. It is time for Jesus to show all of His cards. "He now showed them the full extent of His love." (Jn. 13:1). He gets up from the table and pulls off His outer clothes and grabs a towel. But, instead of using it as a cape and flying out the window, He ties it around His waist and begins to wash the disciple's feet. Whoa. Not what they were expecting. Not what we would expect either. That's because in God's Kingdom men who "kneel" are men of "steel." Jesus illustrates that true heroes are those who serve. They are those who lay down their lives for others.

In my life there have been many heroes. People who have been there to rescue me when I have been in trouble. People who have given me direction when I needed it. They have shown up to save the day in many ways. As we serve one another in Jesus' name we are being a part of God's heroic effort to save the world from death to life. So go and serve!
