## February Book Bite

### **House of Hope**, Books 1 and 2 By Neta Jackson

Even if you have not read the Yada Yada Prayer Group series, which I highly recommend, you will love Neta Jackson's *House of Hope* series.

In the first book, *Where Do I Go?*, Gabrielle Fairbanks finds life very different when she moves to Chicago with her husband, Philip, to further his career. With the move, she hopes to find real purpose in her life. They leave their two sons in Virginia with Philip's parents, supposedly until they get settled in their penthouse apartment.

Shortly after moving, Gabby meets a homeless woman and helps her find shelter in the Manna House Women's Shelter. She discovers that Manna House needs a Program Director, and that she has the right credentials. When the Shelter Director tells her that she feels God has led Gabby to the Manna House, she has a hard time understanding this. She later learns through a song that when you think there is no one else to turn to, you can always go to the Rock. She is introduced to several of the members from the Yada Yada Prayer Group and finds real friendship and strength with these women.

In the second book, *Who Do I Talk To?*, Gabby finds herself and her mother--and her mother's dog-- thrown out of the Penthouse by her husband. Her husband "kidnaps" their sons to go live with their grandparents. Gabby has no place else to turn except to the homeless shelter where she has just resigned from her job. The only way she can expect to have her children returned is to find a place to live, but how does she do this? Extraordinary things happen as Gabby is re-introduced to God.

It is so interesting how Gabby, with her reaffirmed trust and belief in God, picks herself up, dusts herself off and becomes a stronger individual. The next two books in the series, *Who Do I Lean On?* and *Who Is My Shelter?* demonstrate how you can survive when you feel that you have no one to turn to, and find that God has never left you.

The Parkwood Book Group will discuss *Who Do I Talk To?* at our February 11 meeting. Please join us even if you have not had a chance to read the books (which, by the way, are all in the Parkwood Library). We have a great morning of friendship and fellowship once a month while discussing God-centered books that speak to each of us in our own different lives.

## When Somebody Loves You Back

I have decided to use the titles of popular songs for my articles this year, and since February is known as the month of love and romance, I'm going to flow with that theme.

When I was in high school, there was a popular R&B song called *When Somebody Loves You Back*, performed by the handsome Teddy Pendergrass. There's a part in the song where Pendergrass is strongly advocating what he calls a 50/50 love, where each person gives 50 percent to make a relationship whole. Even back then I wondered about that expression, but after having an encounter with Jesus, I definitely disagree with Pendergrass. The Bible teaches that *God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us (Romans 5:8).* That sounds like God gave 100 percent, even when we gave zero percent to him.

If you have a relationship with Jesus, then you know that he always loves you back, even if you're not giving him one hundred percent. We should certainly strive daily to give the Lord full devotion, but if we slip, we know that we have "an advocate with the father" (1 John 1:9). If you do not have a relationship with the Lord, don't allow guilt or shame to keep you away from his love for you. If you open up to him, he will receive you just as you are. If all you have is 30 percent, then offer that to him. Commit to a regular Bible study and fellowship with other believers, and pretty soon that 30 percent will grow to 100 percent devotion.

# You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. - Deuteronomy 6:5

I believe that each person involved in an intimate relationship should give 100 percent. Love can seem so elusive; as often one party feels that they are 100 percent devoted to the relationship while the other party is skating through without any commitment. Conversely, we don't have that concern in our relationship with Jesus because he is fully committed to us.

A few years ago, Britain's Leona Lewis had a hit song called *Bleeding Love*. That title reminds me of the special privileges we have through the blood of Jesus. Hebrews 10:19 says, *We have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us.* The blood of Jesus is our ticket to an intimate love relationship with the God of the universe. And he keeps on "bleeding love" for us. His love covers a multitude of sins, because it is unconditional. When we fall short of 100 percent devotion to him, he still bleeds love towards us every day of the year and not just on Valentine's Day. Finally, just remember that in contrast to Pendergrass' hit song, Jesus remains 100 percent committed to loving us back.

"He (Jesus) entered Jericho and was passing through. And there was a man called by the name of Zaccheus...When Jesus came to the place, He looked up and said to him, 'Zaccheus, hurry and come down, for today I must stay at your house'." (Luke 19:1, 5)

I began to think how many of us do that on our daily journeys. We are so intently focused on the moment-to-moment details that we sometimes miss the bigger experience of life itself. Looking at our calendars on our phones or daytimers making sure that every moment is carefully planned, we put our heads down and watch every individual step and miss the "forest", so to speak.

Jesus was a busy man. His itinerary was quite full, but it seems He was never so busy that He wasn't aware of His surroundings. Jesus was not too busy to notice a short tax collector in a tree near the road. And, by the way, He is not too busy to notice you. The question is, are you too busy to notice Him? God is here. God is with you. Just look up every once in a while, and you will be surprised at what you'll see!
