# Children's Ministry

### M Group

What is M Group and who can attend? M Group (the "M" stands for missions) is our Wednesday night children's activities for ages Preschool (must be 4 by 9/30/13) – 6<sup>th</sup> grade.

M Group is divided into two classes: Pre-K – Kindergarten and  $1^{\rm st}$  –  $6^{\rm th}$  grade. Both classes use the Teamkid curriculum, a discipleship study that encourages kids to step up and do what is right in all parts of their lives. They study the great stories and people in the Bible to learn about issues ranging from the courage to make the right choices, admit when they are wrong, and follow God's leadership. Teamkids' club verse is Proverbs 3:5-6 ~ "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

The younger class, led by Lori West and Mary Hill, meets in Room B-109 from 6:00 to 7:30 PM. During this time they also enjoy music by learning songs, playing instruments, learning about rhythm, and discovering that we can praise God in many different ways.

The older class is led by Jennifer Heiserman, Shirley Readyhough and Elizabeth Gibson. This class meets for Teamkid in Room C-119 from 6:00 to 6:45 PM. At 6:45 the children go to Room A-100 for Music Makers, which runs until 7:30 PM, and is taught by George Scutt, Jennifer Heiserman and Shirley Readyhough. Music Makers is designed to help young voices learn to sing and develop an understanding of basic music.

# The Sufficiency of Christ for Salvation

"For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority. In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by putting off the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ; when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead" (Colossians 2:9-12 NRSV)

We have all *tried*—and keep *trying*—to live the Christian life by carefully *doing* all that is expected of a follower of Jesus Christ. We have tried and desire to have a stronger relationship with God: we pray more, study more to gain biblical knowledge and personal discipline, share more, serve more, give more, and go more, only to find out that our lives are still empty, unfulfilled, and frustrated. Can you identify with this lack of spiritual renewal and growth in your Christian life despite your good intentions and efforts? How do we get out of this rut?

The believers at Colossae were grounded in the Gospel; they were growing and living the Christian life (1:5-6, 23). Their maturity was demonstrated by their faith in Christ and their love for all the saints (1:4). However, false teachers had infiltrated the church teaching that belief in Christ was not enough. They insisted that salvation required Christ plus circumcision, plus a kosher diet, plus observance of feasts and festivals (2:11-15).

Paul responded to this threat to the Colossians by asserting that Christ is all the believer needs. God has provided the believer with every spiritual blessing through Christ: God has circumcised the believer's heart through Christ; God has resurrected and forgiven the believer through Christ; and God has conquered the believer's enemies through Christ. Paul offers the believer a way out of the desperate human situation of self-reliance with the refreshing and liberating truth that Christianity is not about doing things for God; it is about being with God and accepting His gift of grace through Christ (Eph 2:8). When we are with God, in intimate relationship and fellowship, God lives His life in and through us.

If you're tired of performance-based religion, if you are overwhelmed by fruitless, religious routines, then Paul invites and encourages you to focus on the sufficiency of Christ for salvation.

### The Trust Diamond by Twink DeWitt

When a massive wave paralyzed Denny, it pitched both Twink and Denny into a lifestyle of trust. Waiting for the ambulance, they both heard God say, "Trust Me."

Twink studied the facets of God's goodness and mighty power. Then she saw the idea of a diamond, a trust diamond. Each facet represents a characteristic of God or something about the believer's individual life with Jesus. "I had no choice but to write The Trust Diamond," she says. "With a simple example, I can help people learn more about who God is so they can rely on Him daily."

She now understands the power of "doubt dust" which can clog up trust. On her website www.TheTrustDiamond, she blogs about Trust Busters. When we rely on the relentless love and power of God, trust defeats doubt.

The beach accident that initiated their lifestyle of trust happened just a few weeks after Denny retired from the Air Force. Because he could no longer do dentistry on a ship, Denny led the dental department at the Mercy Ships International Office in Texas. (Later he led dental teams to Central America.) But what would Twink do? God had a plan. She would learn to write.

Twink wrote poignant stories about patients treated on board the ships in Africa and Central America. Later she served as editor for the Mercy Ships Newsletter.

After ten years with Mercy Ships, the couple changed to Youth With a Mission, staffing a variety of YWAM schools. This included 12-week introduction to missions schools, 12-week writing schools, and 3-week writing workshops. Authors such as Brock and Bodie Thoene, Elizabeth Sherrill, Mona Hodgson, Pat Rushford teach at the schools. Twink helps writers of all ages hone their skills. Many of her students' books are now published.

The couple now concentrates on speaking, writing, and blogging. Denny has a blog: "Insights from the Life of Christ" also at www.TheTrustDiamond. The DeWitts live in Hideaway, Texas. Their three married sons and seven grandchildren live in Iowa, Indiana, and California. No wonder they love to travel.

Join Twink and Denny on Sunday, October 20 at Parkwood's next Celebrate Christian Literature luncheon where you can hear Twink talk in-depth about the DeWitt's developing trust in God, His leading Twink to write The Trust Diamond and how she helps future writers. ### Does Anybody Really Know What Time It Is?

The right time to do something is different for each individual. The right time to return to school, reconnect with an old friend, change your hairstyle, remarry, adopt a child, retire, write a book, relocate, end a toxic relationship, purchase or sell real estate, is as unique as we are. Therefore, it is imperative that we pay close attention to the cues in our lives.

Proper timing is relative to everything. When the fullness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son (Galatians 4:4). In that same way, we need to respect the proper timing of things in our personal affairs because it gives us access to the divine wisdom

that is custom-made for our particular journey. Secondly, we need to muster the courage to heed that wisdom. Fear can paralyze, but courage will replenish itself as we take one step at a time.

In the 1970s, the band Chicago had a hit song that asked, "Does Anybody Really Know What Time It Is? Does Anybody Really Care?" Time is not an easy concept to grasp, especially when considered in light of eternity. Consider this: sometimes we made poor decisions when we were young, ignorant, or foolish. But often enough, we made the best decision we could have made at the time, depending on our level of maturity, knowledge, resources, and the circumstances that engulfed each situation. Now that we are older, perhaps it is an issue of trust, but we must believe that after we have prayerfully considered all of the variables in our situation, we are still capable of making the best decisions.

Do you know what time it is right now in your life? Perhaps it is time for you to make an appointment for spiritual counseling. Maybe it's time for you to stop belittling yourself or others, or taking precious relationships for granted. It might be time for you to advocate for yourself in the workplace, where you are constantly overlooked and disrespected. If you have been struggling with mental health issues, perhaps it is time for you to stop pretending that you can treat yourself, and seek professional help. Perhaps it is your time to make amends with a long-time friend or a disenfranchised family member. Just because your last attempt at reconciliation did not work, that does not mean that it will not work now. People learn and grow. Hopefully, you have learned and matured as well, so why not go into it expecting a different outcome this time? With all of that said, it is up to you to discover what is most beneficial for your life.

To recap: it could be the "fullness of time" for something different to happen in your life, so pay close attention to the cues. It might take you out of your comfort zone, but that is okay. Your time is in God's hands.
